Presentation Highlights

- Alcohol surveillance global, national reports, and community-based
- Evidence of Alcohol harm: societal (Poor parenting, GBV, injuries, and economic losses) and health impacts including cancers, non-communicable diseases, and deaths.
- Alcohol Policy barriers: cultural norms, industry interference, and funding gaps,
- Local Solution/ Promising practices: Buganda Kingdom: youth-focused alcohol control campaign in all 18 counties, Kisaakate kya Nabagereka mobilizing and inspiring alcohol prevention among young people, Digital prevention treatment initiatives.

Recommendations:

- Stronger regulation (advertising, promotion, and sales.),
- Alcohol Control Bill: continue advocacy, reintroduce the Bill as Government with multisectoral components
- Enforcement of existing measures: Laws e.g. Traffic and Road Safety Act, and utilization of existing frameworks like the SAFER initiative.
- Better coordination: Multisectoral and multilevel interventions (education, health gender...)
- Addressing underlying issues like poverty and unemployment, cultural norms.
